Making New Friends

If you are having a difficult time developing new friendships so you can have someone to mentor or so you can add new friends to mentor, then you need to go through this study. Friendship Growth

Jesus will be revealing five types of relationships for us to identify. This is so we can see how to relate to them during our times of contact with them. These five types of relationships are: Business Relationships, Casual Relationships, Personal Friends, Sincere Friends, and Mentor Friends.

Business And Casual Relationships

We know people on a business or casual level that are open to real friendship. We interact with people we do business and have casual friends. We have gained these relationships through our family and relatives, through our jobs, through school, from our neighborhood, in our church, and through sports. True friendship usually starts out from a business or casual relationship and then grows into a deeper friendship. However, this isn't necessarily a Christian friendship. Christian friendships are developed from these true, deeper friendships.

Business Relationships

A **business relationship** is where you only talk to the person about their products or services. You don't try to talk to them about anything that isn't about the business at hand. These relationships can be at work, in stores, on the phone, by mail, or through the internet. They may be one time contacts or you may see them on a regular basis. Business relationships that have the potential of becoming casual friendships are those that give you an opportunity for repeated contact.

Casual Friendships

A **casual friendship** is a friendship where you and someone else talk about those things you have in common. They can start out with subjects about the weather, sports, things about the company you work for, fellow workers you work around, familiar places and experiences, people you know, and many other common things.

A casual friend may become very open and honest about their family, their business, their successes and failures, and all kinds of general personal things. But, it will need to grow to the place where they feel comfortable talking about their problems, struggles, or issues of life. As long as the conversation remains on subjects that have nothing to do with any of their problems, struggles, or issues of life, it remains a casual relationship.

Personal Friends

As you spend time developing casual friendships with various people, Jesus will open the doors for you to develop a **personal friendship** with some of them. Some of your business acquaintances and casual friends will finally open up and tell you something about things they are struggling with.

When someone tells you something personal, you will need Jesus to give you special responses; He will help you say things that help them continue to feel comfortable with opening up. He will help you encourage them, reward them, and demonstrate real concern for them and the problems they are going through.

After you have given **personal friend** a lot of time to share their problems with you, and after you have asked plenty of questions that have helped you clearly understand what they are GOING through, you will be able to use this opportunity to share with them a similar problem you WENT through and have been able to get the answers and help with.

There are business relationships and casual friendships where people are sincerely looking for the answers to their problems; and, they are willing to enter into the provisions that Jesus has given you. These are people who will eventually become some of your best and closest friends. The enjoyment and fellowship that comes from these friendships make it worth it for you to learn how to be ready to share those things Jesus has done for you.

Sincere Friends

Like with **personal friendships**, **sincere friends** are people who are willing to open up and share the difficult areas of their lives with you. AND, they are willing to listen as you tell them about your life where you WENT through a similar difficulty and found the solutions. However, **sincere friends** will ALSO be willing to listen to you as you tell them what you DID to get that solution.

Mentor Friends

A **personal friend** will be receptive to telling you their problems; a **sincere friend** will do that and will listen to your stories about how you went through similar things; but, **mentor friends** will:

1. Tell you some of the problems they are going through.
2. Will listen to your story about all the things you went through.
3. AND will allow you to tell them what you did to get help.
4. AND will also be willing to do what you did so they can get what you received from Jesus.

When you finally meet them and establish a **mentoring friendship** with them, that is when true friendship begins.

From this study, you will learn how to develop a lot of business relationships, casual friendships, personal friendships, sincere friendships, and mentoring friendships. As Jesus helps you receive His character and attitudes into your personality, He helps you become a much more enjoyable person to be around. Your abilities to care about other people will open your eyes to ways of being helpful and personable with all you meet.

Friendship Growth

Jesus, help me understand the five types of relationships. Help me be able to identify them so I can see how to relate to them during my times of contact with them. Teach me that they are: Business Relationships, Casual Relationships, Personal Friends, Sincere Friends, and Mentor Friends.

Business And Casual Relationships

Jesus, help me understand that there are people I know on a business or casual level that are open to REAL friendship. I interact with people I do business with; I also have casual friends I have gained through my family and relatives, through my jobs, through school, from my neighborhood, in my church, and through sports. Teach me that true friendship usually starts out from a business or casual relationship and then grows into a deeper friendship. However, let me realize that this isn't necessarily a Christian friendship and relationship. A Christian friendship is developed from these true, deeper friendships.

Business Relationships

Jesus, help me see the importance of identifying my **business relationships**. Help me see that even though it is a relationship where I typically only talk to the person about their products or services, You can help me develop it further. In the past, I didn't try to talk to them about anything that didn't pertain to the business at hand. I find these relationships at my place of work, in stores, on the phone, by mail, or through internet communications. Some of them are one time contacts; others I see on a regular basis. Make it clear to me that business relationships have the potential of becoming casual friendships. There are situations that give me an opportunity for repeated contact; help me see if they can be taken further.

Casual Friendships

Jesus, help me see my **casual friendships** is being a friendship where I and someone else talk about those things we have in common. I can start out with subjects about the weather, sports, things about the company I work for, fellow workers I work around, familiar places and experiences, people we both know, and many other common things. Help me stop and be willing to develop many of these types of relationships.

Help me appreciate the fact that a casual friend has the potential of becoming very open and honest. Some of them will gradually be willing to talk about their family, their business, their successes and failures, and all kinds of general personal things. Teach me how to help it grow to the place where they feel comfortable talking to me about their problems, struggles, or issues of life. Show me that as long as the conversation remains on subjects that have nothing to do with any of their problems, struggles, or issues of life, it remains a casual relationship.

Personal Friends

Jesus, as I spend time developing casual friendships with various people, I ask You to open the doors for me to develop a **personal friendship** with some of them. Let some of my business acquaintances and causal friends finally open up and tell me something about things they are struggling with. Then give me the words to help them feel comfortable with the fact that they are opening up. Help me encourage them, reward them, and demonstrate real concern for them and the problems they are going through.

Jesus, after I have given my **personal friends** a lot of time to share their problems with me, and after I have asked plenty of questions that have helped me clearly understand what they are GOING through, help me be able to use this opportunity to share with them. Help me share a similar problem I WENT through; help me share problems I now have the answers and help with from You.

Make it clear to me that there are business relationships and casual friendships where people are sincerely looking for the answers to their problems. And, make it clear to me that they are willing to enter into the provisions that You have given me.

Help me understand that these business people and casual friends are people who will eventually become some of my best and closest friends. Help me look forward to the enjoyment and fellowship that comes from these friendships. Show me that it will make it worth it for me to learn how to be ready to share those things Jesus has done for me.

Sincere Friends

Jesus, teach me that like with **personal friendships, sincere friends** there are people who are willing to open up and share the difficult areas of their lives with me. AND, they are ALSO willing to listen to me as I tell them about areas of my life where I WENT through a similar difficulty and found the solutions. AND, these **sincere friends** will ALSO be willing to listen to me as I tell them what I DID to get that solution.

Mentor Friends

Jesus, like in the friendships that I have with a **sincere person**, teach me that **mentor friends** will:

1. Tell me some of the problems they are going through.
2. Will listen to my story about all the things I went through.
3. Will allow me to tell them what I did to get help.
4. Will ALSO be willing to start doing what I did so they can get what I received from You.

Teach me that when I finally meet them and am able to establish a **mentoring friendship** with them, that is the time when true friendship begins.

Use this study, Jesus, and help me learn how to develop a lot of business relationships, casual friendships, personal friendships, sincere friendships, and mentoring friendships.

As You help me receive Your character and attitudes into my personality, You will help me become a much more enjoyable person to be around. You will increase my abilities to care about other people. That will open my eyes to ways of being helpful and personable with all I meet.

How Do I Get More Friends?

1. Follow Jesus' Pattern

From the beginnings of our relationship with Jesus, we are supposed to be telling those around us that Jesus is Lord and that He is our Lord. Should that not be true, then we need to take a look at Jesus' approach to developing various types of relationships and friendships. He was perfect in the way He approached people and how He tried to offer them help. Let's go over a way to help people by allowing them to decide whether or not they want our help through the power of Jesus.

2. Identify And Define Your Relationships

If you don't accept this assignment from Jesus, you will go about your day and very often not help anyone spiritually. Let's look at the five types of relationships again:

1. There are **business relationships** that are just about buying and selling products to one another.
2. There are **casual friendships** where you talk about things you have in common like the weather, sports, and other people you both know.
3. There are **personal friendships** where they are willing to start opening up and sharing a few of their problems, struggles, or difficulties.
4. There are **sincere friendships** where the person wants help with their issues and problems and are willing to consider getting help from Jesus.
5. And, there are **mentoring friendships** that are people who are willing to join you in getting involved in the programs, books, and studies on this website.

3. Ask Normal, Everyday Questions

The best way to get to know more about a person is to ask them questions about themselves. You aren't trying to GET them into salvation, GET them to attend your church, or GET them into your small group. You are simply trying to GET to know them better. Don't have ANY hidden agenda or future goal planned for them. You don't know where each conversation you have with a person is going to go. By asking them questions, you are just TRYING TO SEE whether or not Jesus has prepared your business relationships, casual friendships, personal friendships, or sincere friendships to move to the next level of friendship.

4. Ask Sincere Questions

In order to find out whether or not each of these relationships are ready to move to the next level, you simply ask them questions you do not know the answers to. With business relationships, if you don't know where they live, ask that question; if you don't know what hobbies they have or special interests, then find out about that. You just need to help them open up and start talking about themselves.

When you ask a question, listen to their answers and memorize these things about them. If Jesus wants them to, your non-threatening questions will take a business relationship to a casual friendship; or, they will take a casual friendship to a personal friendship. As far as you know, it may all stop there and never be able to be taken to the next level; you never know what each person is open to **AND YOU ARE OKAY WITH THAT.**

Understanding The Heart Of Relationships

In building friendships, you must avoid trying to talk people into something.

Friendship building must ALWAYS be times of getting to know more about a person; and, you must be WILLING to let them get to know you. You must allow them to find out about your healings, miracles, blessings, and transformations that Jesus has done for you.

Build Business Relationships

In establishing a **business relationship** you are simply trying to find out what a person has to offer. You are checking out their products and services so you can decide whether or not they have something you want or need. You probably have some criteria as to where you buy these things. It can be price, brand, convenient location, a place where you have always shopped, the way they display their products, or the personnel. Jesus, wants you to reevaluate your criteria for where you do your shopping. As often as possible, you would try to do business with certain people so you can see if Jesus wants a **casual friendship** to be established with them.

Only Jesus knows who will be people He wants you working with. You just have to trust Him to open certain people's hearts to the questions you ask. You will also need to trust Him to block off all relationships He doesn't want you developing.

How Do I Get More Friends?

1. Follow Jesus' Pattern

Jesus, help me understand that from the beginnings of my relationship with You, I was supposed to be telling those around me that You are Lord and that You are my Lord. You were perfect in the way You approached people and how You tried to offer them help. 2. Identify And Define Your Relationships

Jesus, help me accept this assignment from You; I don't want to go about my day and not help anyone spiritually. Take me through the five types of relationships again and help me understand them.

1. I have **business relationships** where I just think about buying and selling products to the person. Help me change and start looking for opportunities to take that relationship to another level.
2. I have **casual friendships** where I talk about things we have in common like the weather, sports, and other people we both know. Help me start finding out whether or not they are open to talking about their personal issues.
3. I have **personal friendships** where they are willing to start opening up and sharing a few of their problems, struggles, or difficulties with me. Help me see if they are willing to let me share some of the victories I have experienced from You.
4. Help me have **sincere friendships** where the person wants help with their issues and problems and are willing to consider getting help from You. Help me be ready and trained so I can provide them with help from You.
5. And, help me have **mentoring friendships** who are people who are willing to join me in getting involved in the programs, books, and studies on this website.

3. Ask Normal, Everyday Questions

Jesus, teach me that the best way to get to know more about a person is to ask them questions about themselves. Help me not be trying to GET them into salvation, GET them to attend my church, or GET them into my small group. Let me simply be trying to GET to know them better. Deliver me from ANY hidden agenda or future goal planned for them. Help me realize that I don't know where each conversation I have with a person is going to go. By asking them questions, I am just TRYING TO SEE whether or not You have prepared my business relationships, casual friendships, personal friendships, or sincere friendships to move to the next level of friendship.

4. Ask Sincere Questions

Jesus, help me see that the way to find out whether or not each of these relationships are ready to move to the next level, I simply ask them questions I do not know the answers to. With business relationships, if I don't know where they live, I ask that question; if I don't know what hobbies they have or special interests, then I find out about that. I just need to help them open up and start talking about themselves.

Jesus, when I ask a question, help me to listen to their answers and memorize these things about them. Help me keep in mind that if You want them to, my non-threatening questions will take a business relationship to a casual friendship; or, they will take a casual friendship to a personal friendship. As far as I know, it may all stop there and never be able to be taken to the next level. Show me that I will never know what each person is open to help me be OKAY WITH THAT.

Help me reevaluate my criteria for where I do my shopping. As often as possible, help me try to do business with certain people so I can see if You want a **casual friendship** to be established with them.

Keep me aware of the fact that only You know who will be people You want me working with. Help me trust You to open certain people's hearts to the questions I ask. Help me also trust You to block off all relationships You don't want me developing.

Building Casual Friendships

In **casual friendships** you are trying to find out what your common experiences and interests are. Do you both like sports; do you both have an interest in the weather; do you have mutual friends; have you visited or lived in some of the same places; or, do you both have similar hobbies, interests, or activities? If Jesus has prepared their heart for you getting to know them better, then they will respond positively to your questions.

Building Personal Friendships

A **casual friendship** moves into a **personal friendship** naturally; you simply start asking more **PERSONAL** questions. What if you ask a casual friend a non-threatening, personal question and they avoid it, change the subject, give you a vague answer, or seem to be offended by it? It is at that point you first check your motives; you want to be sure you aren't trying to push them out of a casual friendship into a personal friendship. If you were just following Jesus' leadership, you won't get hurt, offended, or upset with their unwillingness to go to the next level. It all has to do with testing them because you want to get to know them better.

If you can ask a personal question without trying to make anything happen, then you can go around to all your casual friendships testing to see what Jesus has prepared them for. Simple questions like, "How's it going;" "What's been happening in your life;" "What have you been up to;" and, "How are you doing?" are simple questions we all ask. But, the difference between you and most people is, you **REALLY** want to know.

Checking On Casual Friendships

From time to time you would visit a casual friend again in the natural flow of your daily activities. While talking about casual friendship things, you would ask them another **NON-THREATENING, PERSONAL** question. Your motive would be to simply find out whether or not Jesus had prepared their heart for the next level of friendship. All during this time, you have been praying for them. You have been asking Jesus to speak to them and prepare their heart. But, it **ALL** depends on whether or not they are willing to listen to Jesus.

If once again, they avoid your personal question, change the subject, give you a vague answer, or seem to be offended by it, go back to your regular, casual subjects and move on. You will keep repeating this process every time you get together with them. You never know if or when a casual friendship will move forward. As you keep praying for them, Jesus is working in their life and helping them want more from Jesus. If they are willing, they will respond to Jesus and will be open the next time you ask them a question about how things are going.

Moving From Casual To Personal

Typically, during a **casual friendship** that is about to move into a **personal friendship**, they will mention something that is bothering them. It is at that point you start listening with concern while allowing them to share as much as they feel comfortable with. When they pause or stop sharing the issue with you, you can ask them clarification and information gathering questions about it. This lets you know how much they are willing to share. Be ready to back off and let them know you are praying for those things they shared.

A **personal friendship** is a **casual friendship** where the person is finally ready to move into a deeper relationship. This is BECAUSE the person is starting to desire to open up and share **SOME** of the problems they are going through. Typically they are not yet ready to receive any advice or help; but, they are ready to allow you to know some of their personal issues. Most of these friends just want understanding, concern, and an appreciation for how difficult their life is.

You aren't trying and shouldn't even be willing to help them at this point; you are just spending time listening to and asking questions about those areas where they are willing to share more personal information.

If you push this friendship too soon and start trying to share some of your story or start giving advice, you may close them back up again and lose their trust. But, as you keep showing a sincere interest and offer heart-felt understanding, sympathy, concern, and compassion, they may start asking for your advice and help. That can be your signal that they are ready to move on to the next level. Being gentle, sensitive, caring, and free from personal agendas will help you help them.

Building Casual Friendships

Jesus, teach me that in **casual friendships** I am trying to find out what our common experiences and interests are. Help me find out things like, do we both like sports; are we both concerned about the weather; do we have mutual friends; have we both visited or lived in some of the same places; or, do we both have similar hobbies, interests, or activities? If You have prepared their heart for me getting to know them better, then help me realize that they will respond positively to my questions.

Building Personal Friendships

Jesus, help some of my **casual friendships** to move into **personal friendships** naturally; teach me how to start asking more PERSONAL questions. Show me that if I ask a casual friend a non-threatening, personal question and they avoid it, change the subject, give me a vague answer, or seem to be offended by it, that I should first check my motives. Help me be sure I am not trying to push them out of a casual friendship into a personal friendship. Help me always follow Your leadership; if I do, I won't get hurt, offended, or upset with their unwillingness to go to the next level. Help me ask personal questions to test them because I want to get to know them better.

Help me ask a personal question without trying to make anything happen. Empower me to be able to go around to all my casual friendships testing to see what You have prepared them for. Help me start asking simple questions like, "How's it going;" "What's been happening in your life;" "What have you been up to;" and, "How are you doing?" Even though these are simple questions that most people ask, help me see the difference between me and most people; I REALLY want to know. Help me care what is going on in their lives.

Checking On Casual Friendships

Jesus, help me go from time to time to visit a casual friend in the natural flow of my daily activities. While talking about casual friendship things, show me when to ask them another NON-THREATENING, PERSONAL question. Let my motive be to simply find out whether or not You have prepared their heart for the next level of friendship. All during this time, help me always be praying for them. Help me be asking You to speak to them and prepare their heart. But, help me always stay aware of the fact that it ALL depends on whether or not they are willing to listen to You.

Jesus, if they once again, avoid my personal questions, change the subject, give me a vague answer, or seem to be offended by it, help me go back to my regular, casual subjects and move on. Teach me how to keep repeating this process every time I get together with them. Help me understand that I will never know if or when a casual friendship will move forward. Empower me to keep praying for them and realize that You are working in their life and helping them want more from You. If they are willing, they will respond to You and will be open the next time I ask them a question about how things are going.

Moving From Casual To Personal

Jesus, help me be watching for a change in the attitudes of my **casual friends**. Make it clear to me that typically, during a **casual friendship** that is about to move into a **personal friendship**, they will mention something that is bothering them. Help me, at that point, start listening with concern while allowing them to share as much as they feel comfortable with. When they pause or stop sharing the issue with me, let me ask them clarification and information gathering questions about it. Teach me that this lets me know how much they are willing to share. Help me be ready to back off, if I need to, and let them know I am praying for those things they shared.

Teach me that a **personal friendship** is a **casual friendship** where the person is finally ready to move into a deeper relationship. Show me that this is BECAUSE the person is starting to desire to open up and share SOME of the problems they are going through. But, help me always keep in mind that typically they are not yet ready to receive any advice or help. Help me see that they ARE ready to allow me to know some of their personal issues. Teach me that most of these friends just want understanding, concern, and an appreciation for how difficult their life is.

Jesus, help me not try and not even be willing to help them at this point; let me just spend time listening to and asking questions about those areas where they are willing to share more personal information.

Jesus, make it clear to me that if I push this friendship too soon and start trying to share some of my story or start giving advice, I may close them back up again and lose their trust. But, as I keep showing a sincere interest and offer heart-felt understanding, sympathy, concern, and compassion, they may start asking for my advice and help. Let that be my signal that they are ready to move on to the next level. Help me be gentle, sensitive, caring, and free from personal agendas; let that help me help them.

Friendship Development Instructions

Seeing You Have A Personal Friend

1. They Start To Trust You

You will be able to tell when a **casual friend** is ready to join you in a **personal friendship**. They will start responding positively to your non-threatening, personal questions. They have gradually started trusting you; they are starting to believe you sincerely care about them. You are becoming someone they feel they can trust with important, personal, sensitive, even embarrassing things.

2. Your Questions Can Intensify

Once a **casual friend** starts becoming a **personal friend**, you will be allowed to increase the intensity of your personal questions. You might start asking them how things are going in their life, how a certain issue turned out, is there anything they would like you to pray for them about, or any other personal question that gives them an OPPORTUNITY to show you how open and honest they are willing to be.

3. You Are Allowed To Pray For Them

If a **casual friend** starts sharing more intimate, personal issues and you can see they trust you, it will be a time for you to see if they will allow you to pray for them. If the setting will allow it, you might pray for them right where you are. If not, just let them know you will BE praying for them. Be careful that you don't go to any private setting where their and your integrity is jeopardized.

Holding A Relationship Back

Stories Rather Than Advice

Some people are VERY open to advice and may want your opinion on what you think they should do. If you haven't had a chance to test the friendship by asking more intense personal questions, then you will need to avoid giving that advice. Your story is by far the better way of answering people's questions. If you give advice, then it is open for debate, it looks like it is just your personal opinion, and, it can be one of many things they are considering. If you tell them what Jesus has done for you, then they can't argue with you about it.

Proof Rather Than Opinions

There are people who spend a lot of time simply collecting advice from all kinds of people. They are just looking for those who will agree with them and support them in decisions they have ALL READY made. Once they find out you don't agree with them, they will move on to other people who will give them additional support. By just giving them your story, they will have information that has proven to work; that causes them to reconsider their decisions.

Questions That Bring Hope

Don't Misunderstand; Get The Truth

If you keep avoiding giving **casual friends** and **personal friends** advice and keep asking questions, you will be more qualified to offer personal stories that are more relevant to their situation. Their mind might be made up because they don't see any other way of getting the happiness or solutions they are seeking. If your questions help you find out what their deeper motives are, your story can show them a better way. That can take them from being a person with their mind made up, to a person who is now considering other options.

Questions That Reveal Jesus' Work

During the **personal friendship** level, you are asking questions JUST TO SEE if Jesus has prepared their heart for sharing and how much and how deep they willing to go in that sharing. Your questions are ALWAYS looking for what Jesus has done in their life up to that point. Jesus is answering Your prayers; He is helping them get to the place where they want His help. If they aren't willing to go very deep into their issues or you run out of time to talk about them, then let them know you are available to talk to them about these things at a later time.

Scheduled Meetings

People Who Need More Of Your Time

If they are willing, you can start making appointments to get together so you can listen to more about their concerns and issues. They need time so you can let them feel your non-threatening attitude about what they are going through. If you have more time, you can let them experience your relaxed relationship with them. You will be able to demonstrate the fact that you won't push them; this is done by backing off of anything they avoid or resist.

People Who Are Willing To Give You Time

There are people that you can make arrangements to spend more time with. They want you to have more time to listen to their problems, ask them questions that lead them into sharing deeper information, and ask questions that help you see if they are ready to move into a **sincere friendship**. The more a person demonstrates that they are ready to spend more time with you, and the more they are willing to move to the next level, the more time you will need to spend with them.

Building Sincere Friendships

Know The Difference In The Relationships

In order to take a **personal friendship**, where they are willing to open up and tell you what their problems are, to a **sincere friendship**, where they show a willingness to let you share your story with them, you would give them a very short version of your story. This is a test to see how receptive they are to helpful information. It is a time where you are watching to see how interested they are in what you have to say.

Test Their Receptivity

A quick presentation where you just give them a little taste of what Jesus has done for you, can tell you a lot about their sincerity. As long as it is in the area of their concerns, it can be used as a test to see if they are ready to start listening to you. It is a process where you see if you can gain their interest in hearing more.

Understand The Purpose

If a **personal friend** is moving into a **sincere friend**, you can tell them things that create a desire to keep hearing and learning more. It isn't a story about your life that shows the solution; it is a part of the story that creates interest in finding out more. It would also be an attempt to see if they can gain a certain amount of confidence in your experiences with Jesus. They may be listening; but, they may be listening with reservations. They believe you are trustworthy and sincere; but, they may not see you as one who qualifies to help them. You have to not only be a trustworthy person, your information must be **PROVEN** to be trustworthy. That is accomplished by show them Scriptures from God's Word that establishes it as truth.

Help me see that if I have more time, I can let them experience my relaxed relationship with them. I will be able to demonstrate the fact that I won't push them; then help me do this by empowering me to back off of anything they avoid or resist.

People Who Are Willing To Give You Time

Jesus, there are people that I can make arrangements to spend more time with. They want me to have more time to listen to their problems, ask them questions that lead them into sharing deeper information, and ask questions that help me see if they are ready to move into a **sincere friendship**. Help it not be a story about my life that shows the solution; let it be a part of the story that creates interest in finding out more. They believe I am trustworthy and sincere; but, they may not see that I qualify to help them. I have to not only be a trustworthy person, my information must be PROVEN to be trustworthy. Help me establish that fact through the proof of Your Word.

Tell Your Story

As you keep getting together with a **personal friend**, or **sincere friend**, continue to share little bits of your story with them and see if the successes of your story help them feel comfortable with you telling them more. You will be telling it to your **personal friend** to see if they have come to the place where they want to be helped. You are telling it to your **sincere friend** to see if they are willing to allow that help to come through Jesus. These short versions of your story should include similar problems like the ones they are going through.

The purpose of your story is:

- To let your friends know you have gone through similar things like they are going through.
- To let them know you found the answers to being helped and delivered from such problems.
- To let them know that Jesus was the One Who has blessed, worked miracles, and healed the things in your life.
- To find out whether or not they are interested in moving to the next level of friendship.

Waiting For Their Response

Do They Have Spiritual Comprehension?

After you have shared a portion of your story with a person that you have a **personal friendship** or **sincere friendship** with, you will relax and allow them to respond to that story in any way they wish. You are still just trying to see how far Jesus has taken them and what you should do next. If they don't understand the points of your story, don't show any real interest in it, or don't appear to want the same kind of help, then they need to stay in or go back to the **personal friendship** level.

Will They Ever Have Spiritual Comprehension?

If a person appears to only want to stay in the **personal friendship** level, it is at this point you and Jesus need to decide whether you should continue seeing them, reduce the time you spend with them, or go back to asking more questions.

Your time is limited; there are people all around you who will respond to you and the things Jesus has done for you. It is important that you not take time away from them and give it to someone who won't move forward. Jesus will show you whether or not they will ever go on from there. If He shows you that they just need a little more encouragement, then He will give you more things to share so they can move into or continue in a **sincere friendship**.

Listen To Jesus

We can try to pick who we think would make great Christians. But, only Jesus knows who will move forward. You must relax, give up your personal opinions, and listen to what Jesus has to say about each person. You will get hurt, disappointed, waste time, and cheat other people out of getting their chance to move into the things of Jesus, if you don't follow His leadership.

Testing The Relationship

1. Are They Open To Spiritual Things?

If the people you are working with are willing to let you help them with the **KIND** of help that helped you, then they are ready to become one of your **sincere friends**. If they aren't willing to discuss solutions, or, if they are willing to discuss solutions but they aren't willing to discuss solutions that involve Jesus being the answer, then they aren't ready to move to the **sincere friendship** level yet; and, that was **ALL** you were trying to find out by telling your story.

2. Have They Changed Over Time?

If Jesus wants you to let the relationship stay on the **personal friendship** level, He may have you visit them from time to time, give them more parts of your story, and remind them that He was the One Who helped you. If Jesus tells you they just need time, your friendship will be one where you keep sharing miracles He has worked in your life. This helps them see how great and wonderful He is. It won't be where you keep allowing them to pour more and more of their problems and issues on you. They **MUST** become willing to allow Jesus to help them and change them.

3. Are They Only Open To Human Help?

Don't allow **personal friends** and **sincere friends** pull your own personal advice out of you. Keep telling them what the Biblical principles say, while letting them know that your personal experiences are coming directly from the Bible and Jesus. **Personal friends** and **sincere friends** must not insist on staying where they are and you keep seeing them. They may be fun to talk to; you may want to just make them social friends without any spiritual purpose. But, it is important that you keep in mind that there are people all around you that desperately need your help.

Defining A Sincere Friendship

Do They Want To Be Helped?

A **sincere friendship** is a **personal friendship** that has moved deeper because the person has a desire not only to share their problems, they are ready to grow and get help. You aren't trying to create such a desire in them; you are just trying to find out whether or not that desire is already in them from Jesus. If Jesus hasn't already been working with them and created a desire for change, growth, and a relationship with Him, then they aren't ready for a **sincere friendship**.

Are They Willing To Be Helped By Jesus?

A **sincere friend** responds with sincere answers to your non-threatening, personal questions and parts of your story. You can ask them why they think a certain problem got so bad? You can ask if they are willing to join you in doing things that would help them? You can ask if there is anything they would like you to pray about? Or, you can ask them any other personal question that gives them an **OPPORTUNITY** to open up and start receiving spiritual help from you and Jesus.

Mentor Friendship

A **personal friend** will be receptive to telling you their problems; a **sincere friend** will do that and will listen to your stories about how you went through similar things; but, **mentor friends** will:

1. Tell you some of the problems they are going through.
2. Will listen to your story about all the things you went through.
3. AND will allow you to tell them what you did to get help.
4. AND will also be willing to start doing what you did so they can get what you received from Jesus.

When you finally meet them and are able to establish a **mentoring friendship** with them, that is the time when true friendship begins.

Mentoring Your Friend

Special Features

If a person responds to the various parts of your story positively, then you can start showing them HOW Jesus did the wonderful things He has done for you. Once you and Jesus feel they are ready, you would invite them to take a look at the **Benefits** of HELP eMagazine on the website. If Jesus has so prepared their heart that they show a readiness and willingness to learn how to start doing these studies with you, then move on into **The Discovery Courses**. This is new to them; they will need your assurance that you and Jesus will be with them all the way through. You have already demonstrated patience, love, and friendship to them. They may or may not be all that familiar with computers and devices they will be using. And, it may be hard for them to get familiar with this website.

Have You Covered All The Issues?

Make sure your friend is able to understand and agree with the system that is being presented to them. They may need to discuss schedules, time issues, and what kind of meetings this will require. Spend as much time as is needed to work out the details for them starting the studies with you. It would be good if you could at least do the first few studies together in the same place. If that is not possible, then it would be good to do a practice run. All you would do is help them navigate to the study, get acquainted with their record sheet, set up their browser for the next meeting, and then close down.

Mentor Friendship

Jesus, help me understand that a **personal friend** will be receptive to telling me their problems; a **sincere friend** will do that and will listen to my stories about how I went through similar things; but, **mentor friends** will:

Mentoring Your Friend

Special Features

Once You and I feel they are ready, help me be able to invite them to take a look at the **Benefits** of HELP eMagazine on the website. Let the **Special Features** section of HELP eMagazine start helping them understand why they need to be willing to get involved in the studies.

Always Be Checking Your Friend

Jesus, empower me to assist them in getting help with the issues they are going through. As I go over these **Benefits**, let me be asking them what they think about the various things presented. Help me not just quickly go through the Benefits; give me patience so I will allow them to give me their reactions to as much of these things being presented as possible. Help me ALWAYS be using these things to FIND OUT where You has taken them so far. Show me which is the case so I will know better what to do next.

Always Be Checking With Jesus

Developing A Mentor Friendship

They Need All The Information

A **sincere friendship** to a **mentor friendship** develops NATURALLY through the Special Features presentation. As you and your friend go over these Special Features together, you should give them all the time they need to ask questions, think about those things the Special Features are telling them about, and make up their mind as to whether or not they want to get involved in HELP eMagazine. They shouldn't try to make this decision until they have completed the entire study.

Help Them Learn To Study

Going over the Special Features should take as long as is necessary for your friend to feel comfortable with making a decision. There is no rush; you just need to walk them through it at a pace that is best for them. Read short groups of paragraphs and then allow them to tell you what they think. Be willing to answer any questions or objections they may have; but, try to encourage them to get their answers from the Special Features. They need to learn to trust the material; and, they need to learn how to get the answers for themselves.

Help Them Develop Patience

In most cases, the particular issue or question your **mentor friend** has will soon be covered. Let them know you have reviewed the material and have seen the answer. Then ask them to be looking for that answer as they go through the information. Your Story And The Special Features

Illustrations Help With Learning

All during the time of going through the Special Features, you will need to keep sharing YOUR STORY with them. To Mentor Or Not To Mentor

If they don't want to do the studies with you but are willing to let you give them advice, then you will need to pray and ask Jesus whether or not He wants you to continue to do that.

Some of your sincere friends will not be willing to go beyond you “spoon feeding” the information to them.

Dealing With The Lazy

I'm Not Getting Anything Out Of This

You will probably find people who want you to do all the work for them. They won't be willing to read, study, or put out the effort for getting the information for themselves. They will ask or maybe even demand that you “just tell it” to them. They may have excuses, crises, circumstances, and all kinds of other reasons for not having time or the ability to do studies with you.

They MUST Read The Material

There's a way to keep helping these people without you doing all the work. You can require that they read the material on their own; then you discuss it at the scheduled time. You will need to have “tests” that help prove that they did actually read the material. The more you ask questions that force them to refer to the material, the more they will see that you WILL NOT spoon feed them.

Let Jesus Guide You

You and Jesus will have to decide if or for how long you will be willing to do their work for them. Some will just need you to help them get started and then they will take off and do the studies with you. For others, it may be a problem with laziness or a lack of spiritual desire to “do what it takes” to do the studies in HELP eMagazine. If they are ever going to become a true **mentor friend**, then they are going to have to start doing the studies on their own under your mentoring.

Always Be Testing The Relationship

Some relationships and friendships will stop at some level for a while and then suddenly move to the next level. Jesus will have done something in their heart that helped them get ready for that level. ALL level increases are caused by the person being willing to yield to Jesus as He deals with them personally.

Pray To Do Your Part

It is vital that you not feel responsible for taking your friends to the next level, BECAUSE you are not able to. Ask Jesus to help you accept responsibility for being a constant friend; ask Jesus to help you accept your job of CHECKING, from time to time, to see what He has gotten them ready to talk about and do. The questions Jesus keeps giving you will help you check and see how they are doing. He will help you see if they have allowed Him to prepare them for moving to the next level of friendship; that part is all dependent on them and Jesus.

Regressing Friendships

People may move forward into a friendship that involves you getting to know them better and then fall back to a place where they don't want to be there anymore. You and Jesus have to decide what to do about each situation you face, when a relationship regresses. He will have to let you know whether to just drop the relationship all together, or, just go back to doing business with them and reestablish a **casual relationship** or **business relationship** with them. It is a matter of you and Jesus deciding whether or not to keep pursuing the relationship. However, we must treat these people with love, respect, and kindness if our paths cross. We must not allow disappointment, frustration, or resentment enter our heart.

Flexibility

Changing Methods Of Relationship

Let's say you have a **mentor friend** that is doing studies with you and all of a sudden they don't want to do it anymore. If Jesus wants you to stay in touch with them, you might go all the way back to a **business relationship**. Depending on what the person is willing to allow, you will need to maintain contact with them by using the methods discussed in that type of relationship.

Find Out What Is Going On

Don't ASSUME anything as to why you think a person is resisting a certain level of friendship. QUESTIONS are still the best way of helping and bringing healing to a relationship. Let THEM tell you what kind of issues and problems they are going through that are causing them to back off. If they don't want to talk about it, then find out from Jesus what you should do next.

There Are A Lot Of Reasons

There can be things that are too embarrassing for them to be willing to discuss with you. It can be a lack of spiritual desire; it can be circumstances that they don't think you would understand; it can be influences from other people who are resisting their relationship with you. It can be any of a number of things that they may or may not be willing to talk about.

Nonproductive Relationships

You Can't Mentor Everyone

Not all relationships will be for the purpose of building them into productive relationships of spiritual growth. Many of your **business relationships** will only be about you buying and selling things that make this life possible. They may never be about building those relationships and taking them to the next level.

You Can't Make Things Happen

We are to treat everyone with love, respect, and kindness. We must not start trying to manipulate people. During family times with relatives and times of playing sports, there will be people around you that you will just be friendly to. You will be friendly to them because of the wonderful things Jesus has done in your life. It is important that you just let relationships develop as Jesus and these people allow you to. We need to not try to force anything on these people. We need Jesus to guide us every moment of everyday to trust Him with all these decisions.

You Can Be Kind To Everyone

We all have a responsibility to be loving, caring, and cordial with ALL those around us. Sometimes the way we treat the people around us helps them see what Christianity is all about. We don't treat people a certain way just because they are our friends. Jesus wants us to be loving and caring even with our enemies.

Someone Else's Friend

You Are Planting Seeds

Some of the people you cross paths with will eventually become involved in spiritual growth with someone else. As the love of Jesus pours out of you on everyone you come in contact with, special spiritual seeds are planted in their hearts. Jesus may not use you to do any more in their life than just be friendly to them as you pass by. As you allow Jesus to shine through you into everyone's life, many are prepared for being open to other Christians at a later date.

Yield To Jesus' Leadership

If we allow Jesus to free us from all personal agendas, we won't be going around looking for people to mentor. We will be allowing Jesus to flow through us so as to do WHATEVER He wants done. All kinds of people will be entering and leaving your life; only Jesus knows and is able to pick which ones should spend more time with you. Just want to do His will and He will empower you to be at the right place, at the right time, doing and saying the right things with the right people.

Diagnosing Friendships

There are **business relationships** that never grow any farther.

There are **casual friendships** where all the person wants to do is talk about the weather, sports, business, other people, and unimportant things.

There are **personal friendships** where all the person wants to talk about are their problems. They don't want ANYONE helping them with those problems; they just want to gripe, complain, and gossip about them.

There are **sincere friendships** where the person wants help but they don't want it from Jesus. There are also **sincere friendships** that want help with their issues and problems and are willing to CONSIDER getting help from Jesus, but, once they give Him a try, they decide against Him.

And, there are **mentoring friendships** that are willing to join you in doing HELP eMagazine. But they don't want to spend a lot of time with it. They say all the right things and give all the right impressions; but, fall short in performance.

Giving Proper Treatment

Business Relationships

In dealing with **business relationships** that never grow any farther, it is always a matter of staying in touch with Jesus. Your time will always be limited; if you are in the wrong place, talking to the wrong person, then you are neglecting the person that Jesus wants you to be spending time with. You may like a person very much and see great potential in them; but, if Jesus knows they are not yet ready, then you need to follow His leadership.

Casual Friendships

Within **casual friendships** there will probably be people who are family members, close friends from school, sports, work, and other places. These may be people you love very much and want the very best for them. However, you must honor their free will just like you would anyone else. If you push them or give them unusual attention, you are mistreating them and neglecting the people Jesus wants you to spend time with.

Time and effort are always the issue; if Jesus wants you to spend time with them building a **casual friendship**, then it is okay. But, if you are just spending time because they are talking about things you are interested in, then it isn't a relationship that will build God's Kingdom.

Personal Friendships

With those **personal friendships** where all the person wants to talk about is their problems, and, you can tell that they don't want ANYONE helping them with those problems, you will need to keep talking about Jesus and the things of Jesus. If this damages the relationship where they don't want to talk to you anymore, then it is your indication that they aren't ready.

Jesus has to decide whether they are always going to be like this or you just need to keep bringing the subject back to the fact that they need to start thinking about being helped by Jesus.

Sincere Friendships

In those **sincere friendships** where the person wants help but they don't want it from Jesus. They may want advice, opinions, support, or sympathy; but, when you try to take them into doing studies with you, they give excuses, resist, or keep delaying the process.

They may SINCERELY want help; they just don't yet see Jesus as being their answer. They may be afraid of spiritual things; or, they may never want to go in that direction; you and Jesus will have to decide what to do with them. Ask Jesus to help you with questions that will assist you in finding out where they stand.

There are people who are willing to establish **sincere friendships**; they will want help with their issues and problems and will be willing to CONSIDER getting help from Jesus. Some of these people may be on the fence and haven't decided how they feel about Jesus. As you try to take them into looking at the Benefits of HELP eMagazine, you will better be able to see what their problem is. If they don't want help from Jesus, DON'T BE WILLING TO TRY SOMETHING ELSE.

Mentor Friendships

With **mentoring friendships** there are those willing to join you in doing HELP eMagazine. But, there will be levels of commitment where some do them on a daily basis and others don't. There will be time issues where some have a life filled with other things. You will need to help them establish priorities and help them clean out distractions. Teach me that time and effort are always the issue; if You want me to spend time with them building a **casual friendship**, then it is okay. But, if I am just spending time because they are talking about things I am interested in, then show me that it isn't a relationship that will build God's Kingdom.

Personal Friendships

Jesus, with those **personal friendships** where all the person wants to talk about are their problems, and, You are showing me that they don't want ANYONE helping them with those problems, empower me to keep talking about You and the things about You. If this damages the relationship where they don't want to talk to me anymore, then let that be my indication that they aren't ready yet.

Help me let You decide whether people who are only willing to talk about their problems but won't accept help are always going to be like this; or, if I just need to keep bringing the subject back to them starting to think about being helped by You, then show me what to do.

Sincere Friendships

Jesus, in those **sincere friendships** where the person wants help but they don't want it from You. If they just want advice, opinions, support, or sympathy, help me stay on track with talking about You. If when I try to take them into doing studies with me, they give excuses, resist, or keep delaying the process, show me what to do next.

Jesus, if a person SINCERELY wants help, but, they just don't yet see You as being their answer, help me lead them into a wonderful relationship with You. If they are afraid of spiritual things, let me help them with it. If they will never want to go in that direction, help me move on. Give me insight so You and I can decide what to do with these people. Help me with questions that will assist me in finding out where they stand.

Jesus, help me with people who are willing to establish **sincere friendships**; people who want help with their issues and problems and will be willing to CONSIDER getting help from You. If some of these people are on the fence and haven't decided how they feel about You, help me lead them into a relationship with You. As I try to take them into looking at the Benefits of HELP eMagazine, help me see what their problems are regarding You. But, if it turns out that they don't want help from You, empower me to NOT BE WILLING TO TRY SOMETHING ELSE.

Mentor Friendships

Jesus in my **mentoring friendships** prepare me for helping those who are willing to join me in doing HELP eMagazine courses. But, teach me that there will be levels of commitment where some do them on a daily basis and others don't. Help me be able to deal with their time issues where some of them have a life filled with other things. Lead me into Your training on how to help them establish priorities and assist them in cleaning out distractions. Get me ready to help them with circumstances that attack them, distract them, damage them, and confuse them. As these types of situations are dealt with in **The Discovery Courses**; train me on being very good at using them.
